GHHP'S *lOth annual*REPORT CARD



Launched on 22 November 2024, the 10th annual Gladstone Harbour Report Card highlights a decade of data on Harbour health from July 2023 to June 2024. It updates environmental indicators, economic performance, and stimulus results. While no new social or cultural assessments were done this year, past results have remained stable.

This edition features trend graphs for key indicators like water and sediment quality, seagrass, mud crabs, and fish recruitment, helping us track changes over time.

It also includes findings from the 2022–2023 litter and marine debris assessment, plus insights from the Human Dimensions survey reflecting community views.

URBAN WATER STEWARDSHIP Framework

Managing urban water is key to protecting our waterways, Harbour, and the Great Barrier Reef. The Urban Water Stewardship Framework (UWSF), developed by the Department of Environment, Tourism, Science, and Innovation, helps councils in the Great Barrier Reef catchment, including Gladstone Regional Council, improve urban water management.

On 13 March, Gladstone Regional Council representatives met to undertake the third biennial assessment, providing an opportunity to share knowledge, celebrate achievements, and plan for future action.

The results of the UWSF will be shared with the community after the final report is developed.

The Urban Water Stewardship Framework's objective is to contribute meaningfully to improving urban water management practices, and in doing so, help achieve Reef 2050 Water Quality Improvement Plan targets through urban sediment and nutrient load reductions.

TRADITIONAL OWNER values

GHHP has previously reported on Cultural: Indigenous Cultural Heritage through a series of assessments focused on the health of culturally significant sites in the Gladstone region. As part of the GHHP Ten-Year Review, the Independent Science Panel recommended expanding this approach to develop a more meaningful and holistic representation of Traditional Owner perspectives.

This led to the creation of a new assessment component using Traditional Owner-led approach: Traditional Owner Values.

To develop this approach, GHHP has been working closely with Traditional Owners, including a workshop to facilitate deeper discussions on the GHHP Report Card.

FISH HEALTH ASSESSMENT index

Fish are an important indicator of environmental health, as they're exposed to contaminants throughout their life cycle. In 2018, CQUniversity began monitoring fish health in Gladstone Harbour, focusing on multiple organs and tissues. This assessment helps us understand the stressors affecting fish populations in the Harbour.

CQUniversity conducted assessments in 2018, 2019, and 2020 before pausing the program due to various factors. Following the Ten-Year Review, the Independent Science Panel recommended bringing this assessment back into GHHP's monitoring program, and we're excited to restart it for the 2025 Report Card.

The biennial What's Our Grade Report, facilitated by Darwinian Consulting, aims to assess the Partnership across five indicators: staff cohesiveness, science credibility, organisation resilience, stakeholder relevance, and outreach effectiveness.

The assessment surveyed individual GHHP staff members, the GHHP team as a whole, Partners, and the Host Organisation.

GHHP is delighted to announce that the Partnership has improved from a B+ in 2022, to an A- in 2024, with many indicators improving over time, particularly within Outreach Effectiveness, indicating GHHP's commitment to community and Partner engagement.
